# **Areas of Expertise**

### **Personal Injury**

Roger advises and represents both Claimants and Defendants in all types of personal cases including road traffic accidents, accidents at work and fatal accidents. Over the years he has been involved in cases involving brain injuries, spinal injuries, cauda equina syndrome, amputations, chronic pain, scarring, loss of sight and every kind of orthopaedic injury.

- A v MR (2020) Roger represented the Claimant who was using an unguarded mincing machine when his dominant right hand became caught in it. His hand had to be amputated at the wrist. Damages were assessed by the High Court at £1.99 million.
- H v HHGL (2020) Roger acted for the Claimant in a fatal accident claim involving a widower and two children under the age of 10. Extensive claims for past and future loss of earnings and care. Case settled for £1.05 million after provision of a detailed schedule and extensive negotiations.
- M v CICA (2019) Roger acted for a lady who was the victim of an assault. A maximum award of £500,000 was achieved less a 20% reduction in respect of the Claimant's conduct.
- A v MOD (2020) Roger acted for a serviceman injured at work who was medically discharged from the services with chronic pain and psychological issues.

#### Industrial disease

Roger advises and represents both Claimant and Defendants in all types of industrial disease cases including those

involving asbestos, asthma, work related upper limb disorders, hand/arm vibration syndrome and industrial deafness.

• W v NNHS (2020) Roger acted for the Claimant in a work related upper limb disorder claim involving a sonographer scanning pregnant ladies who developed a shoulder injury.

#### **Professional Negligence**

Roger advises and represents Claimants who have been the victims of solicitor's negligence in the conduct of their personal injury or fatal accident claims.

• **T v MES** (2018) Roger acted for a self-employed man whose loss of earnings claim had been valued and presented negligently by the solicitors acting for him.

### **Clinical Negligence**

Roger advises and represents Claimants who have been the victims of clinical negligence.

• W v S&S (2018) Roger acted for a female solicitor in her claim for clinical negligence in respect of a delay in diagnosing her anal carcinoma leading to a permanent colostomy.
